

## **BAR FOUNDATION MOVING AND WELCOMING NEW BOARD MEMBERS**

CONCORD, NH – As of June 12, 2006, the New Hampshire Bar Foundation will be relocated to 2 Pillsbury Street, Suite 300, Concord, NH 03301-3502. The Bar Foundation provides grants to organizations providing free or reduced-fee civil legal services for the disadvantaged in New Hampshire, and is a key funder of programs that provide law-related education for students and the general public. Since its founding in 1977, the NH Bar Foundation has provided more than \$20 million in direct funding to organizations and programs serving residents statewide. The Foundation has been located at 112 Pleasant Street in Concord since the early 1990s. The NH Bar Foundation is moving to the same location as the NH Bar Association, a membership organization serving New Hampshire lawyers.

**Bonnie Boulanger**, of Hatem & Donovan, P.C., is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and received both her J.D. and her L.L.M. from Franklin Pierce Law Center.

Admitted in 2001, Attorney Boulanger is an active member of the New Hampshire Bar Association, serving on the Law-Related Education Committee and regularly volunteering for Bar Association sponsored programs such as Mock Trial, We the People, and the Pro Bono Program. She is also committed to community service and serves on several national and local boards, including the Salem Bar Association, the St. Anthony of Padua School Board, the New Hampshire Young Inventors' Program, and the Patient Affairs Committee of the United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS).

**Wilbur A. (Bill) Glahn** is a partner and Chair of the Business Litigation Group at McLane, Graf, Raulerson & Middleton. In recent years his practice has focused on corporate litigation, including contract, corporate governance and shareholder disputes. He has more than thirty years of trial experience in a wide variety of trial work, including tax, securities, trade secret and employment litigation.

Attorney Glahn received a B.A. from Trinity College and a JD from the University of Chicago School of Law. From 1975 to 1981 he was an Assistant Attorney General in New Hampshire and was Chief of the Civil Division of that office from 1978-1981.

**Douglas P. Hill** has been a partner at Nungesser & Hill, Meredith, since 1977. He serves as counsel to conservation organizations, municipalities, and individuals in land related matters including zoning, conservation, boundaries and titles.

Attorney Hill graduated from Dartmouth College in 1966, and from Boston University School of Law (*cum laude*) in 1973. He served as Law Clerk to Justice Lawrence I. Duncan at the N.H.
